He has been teaching in the classroom using the Direct Instruction model and has also been providing breakfast and lunches for the students. He has been well received by the community and I have enjoyed catching his profile on TV as he has developed into a media identity. I know Matt is well respected across many Queensland communities and is the perfect person to assist in this difficult time as his communication and experience is of the highest calibre.

I am extremely proud of our music student performances organised by Mrs Nieuwenberg every Friday at the Piazza. Furthermore, our sporting teams and coaches have achieved great results against other schools in the district and represent our school with pride. Our sporting profile in the region has continued to grow and I am always impressed by the number of students representing the school. I would also like to congratulate Jez Sykes, year 10, who has won a community scholarship for the essay he wrote in response to the topic: 'Differences between the Queensland Police system and the Italian Police system'. In other news, I was fortunate to attend a breakfast with guest speaker Jessica Watson recently with Miss Thomson and was astounded with her honest and frank description of her journey to circumnavigate the globe solo and unassisted when she was just 16 years of age. Despite being diagnosed with dyslexia at age 11, Jessica, who had fantastic support from her parents, was able to achieve this unimaginable feat and was presented with the Young Australian of the year award. Since her journey, Jessica is current studying for her MBA and also works for the United Nations. The most interesting story that she shared with us in her presentation, is that on the first day of her journey outside of Morton Bay, she had a collision with a 65000 tonnes container ship and damaged her boat. Despite criticism across the globe, Jessica set sail and the rest is history. A great lesson in this for our students is that if you make a mistake at the start, there is a big opportunity to learn and continue on. If you quit because of failure, you will not be able to learn from your mistakes. Resilience is a key trait that we want our children to develop. University of Queensland Child Health Study

My name is Dr Amy Mitchell, and I am a Research Fellow at the Parenting and Family Support Centre at the University of Queensland.

Our research aims to find out more about how we can best support parents and "healthy" siblings of children with chronic health conditions. Tens of thousands of Australian children suffer from one or more chronic health conditions, and these illnesses and the treatments that go along with them can have a major impact on the entire family.

Our important new study is exploring the lived experience of siblings of children with chronic health conditions, and will help inform the development and tailoring of programs to better support children and families.



What impact to long-term child health problems have on families?

One in three Australian children has an ongoing, chronic health condition (e.g. asthma, eczema, diabetes, epilepsy, and others). Dr Amy Mitchell from the University of Queensland is seeking families of children with a chronic health condition to take part a research study exploring the impact of chronic childhood illness on well siblings. Parents and well siblings (aged 6-12 years) will be invited to participate in a brief (<60 mins) face-to-face interview. This study will help inform future programs to support children and families.
